- 1 Practice A: Practice reading aloud [5 min.]
- ✓ Purpose: To check the pronunciation and intonation
- ✓ Procedure: Sharing "CARD 1: Conversation Model" (Page 2), tell the two students to read aloud the conversation on the card.
- 2 Practice B: Answering the questions [10 min]
- ✓ Purpose: To review familiar conversation patterns the students have learned in the previous lesson.
- ✓ Procedure: Ask one question from the questions listed below for each student. Please add a followup question related to the first one.
