Title	Experiences
Target sentence patterns	Have you ever... / Yes I have · No I haven't Where/Who/How/What/overall questions on p.110
Key Questions / Expressions	Students should be able to understand and use adjectives on p.106, to answer questions about their past experiences. All students have been taught the phrase “best ever holiday”.
Special notes	<p>Avoid asking about “worst” ever holidays to avoid negative stories. Consider asking about “funny” or “weird” holidays instead.</p> <p>As always, please discuss your own experience and allow them to ask questions.</p> <p>A suggested lesson plan is provided here:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Greeting: “how do you feel right now?”. They always say “sleepy”, so elicit <u>tired</u> on p.106 to remind them of ed/ing difference. - Show a list of experiences from the textbook, and ask each student to say which one is...[e.g. scary, amazing, etc.] - Do a “have you ever” speed question round. Example provided here: https://pickerwheel.com/pw?id=ECxcx - Drill “yes I have, it was...” and “no I haven't...yet” while asking a few of these random questions

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Instruct students to share their best trip. Ask them questions from p.110 - Share your best trip, or a fabricated story of one. Make it easy for you, and a combined skill exercise for them, by showing your script on the screen as you talk. You can check if your script is too complex beforehand with https://www.oxfordlearnersdictionaries.com/text-checker/ to make sure learners follow. Aim for mostly A1 and A2 vocabulary.
