Unit	18 (The Future)
Objectives	Ask and answer questions about future plans using the correct future tense verbs
Target sentence patterns	Future tense verbs (page 133) Plans: I am going to, I will / Dreams: I would like to, I hope to Etc.
Key Questions	What would you like to do after you graduate? Do you have a New Year's resolution?
Special Notes	This topic can be difficult. First, students lack ideas for their future, so you should avoid long-term questions like "30 years from now" or "in 50 years". Similarly, it may be difficult to share your experiences if they ask you what your plans are for (for example) "after teaching". Use the idea of New Year's resolution to swap stories, then focus on them practicing future tense. Question time can be anything, since this is likely the last time they will see you. Example plan below
Example lesson flow	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Warm up by asking about their New Year's break (27th Dec~9th Jan) - Compare New Year's resolutions briefly. If you do not want to share your real resolution, take one from lists of common resolutions such as https://www.statista.com/chart/29019/most-common-new-years-resolutions-us/ or https://yougov.co.uk/society/articles/51150-what-new-years-resolutions-are-britons-making-for-2025 - Play a simple game of "what's missing?" Show images of future plans once. Then the next time you share the image/slide/document some parts have been removed, and they have to remember which. - Ask which of the plans in the images they would like to do / plan to do. - Elicit easy steps for a big long-term goal. Give one example
