Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Greeting people / showing responses. • Start a small talk and continue the talk
Key Questions / Words / Phrases	<p>Warm up by</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. greeting your students (Page 33 (Practice)). 2. asking students about their activities over the last weekend. <p>Practice questions from P.31(C), P.33(A) and P.34(A). Challenge your students with follow-up questions.</p> <p>If time permits, let students practice a short talk about their part-time job (Page 35(A)).</p>
Special Note	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be aware of turn-taking issue. Please kindly give each student equal amount of time if possible. • Encourage your students to talk more by giving them simple closed-ended questions. For high-level students, open-ended questions will be fine. • Start from something simple, but gradually challenge them with follow-up questions. For example. What is your major? -->Why did you choose this major? • If you ask the same question by rephrasing it too much, you may confuse your students even more. Sometimes giving them sample answers is the best approach. • Assess student's level, and please talk slowly when necessary. • Avoid using difficult words if their level is low. Also try not to explain complicated word definition. • Make sure your students ask you questions too! • Please avoid too much correction of grammar mistakes. If the sentence is comprehensible, then let the conversation flow.
