Why? / Do you think it's more important to make a lot of money or to enjoy your job? / What's a job you wouldn't want to do? / When you were a child, what did you want to be? / Would you rather a taxi driver or a police officer? / Would you rather work indoors or outdoors? / What's a job that you would find really boring? / What's your dream job?</p>
